Principal's Report

Our first P&C meeting for the year was well attended and part of the discussion centred around fundraising and school uniforms. In Term 2 we will once again have a Class Coin Drive where students can bring in coins to collect for the P&C. The class which raises the most will be rewarded with a 'spider 'drink. We will also be sending out a uniform survey next term to gauge your opinions on our school uniform. The next meeting will be Wednesday 28 April at 7.00pm.

I have asked all teachers to give new log-in details to any families who are not on Classdojo. We use this platform to reach our community quickly for upto-date messages and information. Please take the time to register with the Classdojo phone app if you haven't already done so to get the latest school news.

We have approval to replace the K-2 fixed equipment as well as to make a sensory play area. This work should take place early Term 2 and will take approximately 2 weeks for completion. This will be a big improvement of the play area for our younger students.

We have Parent / Teacher interviews in Week 9 which is an excellent way of connecting with your child's class teacher and discussing progress, any concerns and celebrating achievements. Interview time sheets were due back on Friday 12 March so if you haven't already done so, please send it back this week.

Did you know that if your child misses 1 day of school per fortnight, it adds up to 20 days per year? That's 4 weeks of learning and mixing with their friends. Over the 13 years of schooling, that means your child would have missed 1 ½ years of school.

You will need to thoroughly outline your reasons for seeking nonlocal placement and many high schools also require you to provide supporting evidence and documentation. If you have any queries about completing the Expression of Interest please speak to your child's class teacher

K – 2 Easter Hat Preparations

Students in Kindergarten, Year 1 and Year 2 will be decorating their Easter hat creations at school in class.

Kindergarten to Year 2 students will be making their hats with their Primary buddy class.

All materials will need to be at school in a plastic bag marked with your child's name on it by **Monday 22 March** ready for construction of the hats to commence that week.

All students will receive a colourful Easter bookmark to encourage reading in the holiday break.

Please ensure your child brings sunscreen and their school hat each Friday to protect them from the sun. They also need to have a filled water bottle each week to keep them hydrated throughout the morning.

School Photos

Photo Day is on **Wednesday 31 March**. Payment envelopes have been sent home with all students.

Correct payment and order envelopes must be brought in on Photo Day (Wednesday 31 March). Please do not return your envelope prior to Photo Day as envelopes are handed directly to the photographers on the day.

If you have more than one child at the school and would like a family photo, envelopes are available at the front office. These photos will only be taken if the pre-paid envelope and payment is returned on photo day. Ordering online for family photographs will cut off at 12.00 midnight the night before photo day.

Don Wood Photography offer two methods of payment:

Online payments

Login to <u>www.donwoodphotograpghy.com.au</u> using the schools unique school code which is **387517**. No envelope is required to be brought back to the school as all orders are processed online.

If ordering online, parents will have up to 5 days after the date of photography to order their child's portrait or group packages online as a pre-order. After this time a late order must be placed. Additional charges may apply.

Cash

If cash payments are preferred, place correct money into the Don Wood Photography envelope with the student's name, class and package clearly marked. Please note: envelopes must be handed to the Don Wood Photography team on photo day. If paying with cash each student must present their own envelope.

Please check your order carefully as refunds are not available for incorrect package choice.

Student Pick-Up Arrangements

Please notify the office on **9153 9756** or **9153 5578** if there are any changes to your child's after school pick up arrangements so this information can be passed on to their class teacher. This will help ensure the safety and well-being of all students.

If you are going to be late picking your child up it is also important that you contact the school prior to 3.20pm.

Parent / Teacher Interviews

Just a reminder that Parent/Teacher interviews are being held in Week 9. All interviews will take place in the Library.

Morning interviews will be held from 8.00am -11.00am and afternoon interviews will take place from 2.00pm – 5.00pm.

- Kindergarten interviews will take place on Monday 22 March
- Stage 1 & 5/6F interviews will take place on Tuesday 23 March
- Stage 2 interviews will take place on Thursday 25 March
- 5/6K, 5/6R & 5/6S interviews will take place on Wednesday 24 March

These interviews are an important way to share information in order to assist your child to achieve the best possible outcomes.

To make the most of the occasion:

- Spend some time with your child before the parent/teacher interview discussing their strengths/weaknesses and any problems they feel they have at school
- Make a list of questions to ask the teacher about your child's work, how they get along with classmates and their general attitude to school
- Ask questions, especially if you don't understand something
- Try to take away from the interview some positive steps that you, your child and class teacher can take to help your child succeed

Please be mindful that interviews are limited to 10 – 15 minutes



School Attendance

Education for your child is important and regular attendance at school is essential for your child to achieve their educational best and increase their career and life options. NSW public schools work in partnership with parents to encourage and support regular attendance of children and young people.

When your child attends school every day, learning becomes easier and your child will build and maintain friendships with other children.

There are a number of reasons for you to ensure that your child attends school regularly. Attending school every day makes learning easier. For younger students, missing the basic skills often leads to learning problems later on and for older students, absenteeism often interferes with academic progress. Friendships with other students are also easier if your child attends school regularly.

Sickness and injuries, attendance at a special religious ceremony or serious family situations are acceptable reasons for non-attendance at school. Birthdays, haircuts, pension days, Mondayitis etc are not satisfactory reasons for absences from school. If you have difficulties getting your child to school every day and on time, please talk to their class teacher or Mrs Monin.

If your child is absent for any reason, please send a signed note explaining the reason for their absence on the day they return to school. If your child will be absent for 3 days or more, please notify their class teacher through Class Dojo or call the school on 9153 9756 or 9153 5578.

Safe School Travel

Children are vulnerable road users. They are at risk in the traffic environment because of their size, their difficulty in judging speed and distance and the fact that they may behave unpredictably.

More than one million children in NSW travel to and from school each day by car, bike, public transport or as a pedestrian. Each form of transport poses potential hazards. The RTA has in place 40km school zones and also funds a Road Safety Education program in NSW schools. This alone is not enough – you can help by following some simple safety steps and by regularly reinforcing important road safety messages with your child.

- Always make sure your children wear a seat belt when travelling in a car – about 50% of child road casualties aged 5-14 are passengers in a car
- Make sure children use the footpath-side door when getting in and out of a car
- Never call your child from across the road
- Use a pedestrian crossing where possible

School Parking

Parking for parents is available along Mountview Ave, Chamberlain St and further down Broad Arrow Rd. Please ensure you park in the appropriate street spaces along these streets.

Take note and comply with the 'No Stopping' and 'Bus Zone' areas near the school and keep our driveway clear. The first area of parking in front of the school is the 'Kiss and Drop' zone. In this area drivers may stop to drop off or pick up children however 'No Parking' rules apply.

- Maximum stop time is 2 minutes
- Driver must remain in or within 3 metres of the vehicle
- Vehicle must not be left unattended.

The police and rangers patrol the school regularly. Fines can be quite expensive for parking illegally around a school.

Please keep the school driveway clear at all times and be mindful of our neighbours when parking near the school.

Homework

Homework reinforces work done at school and helps develop skills such as research and time management.

Parents and carers have the opportunity to help through a positive and supportive approach to homework.

Some homework tips include:

- Support your child in setting aside time each day for homework
- Provide a dedicated place for homework and study if possible
- Encourage your child to read and take an interest in current events
- Plan the work to be done and the time to be spent on each task
- Take short breaks between homework tasks
- Praise your child for their efforts not just their results
- Alert your child's class teacher to any domestic circumstances or extra-curricular activities which may need to be taken into consideration when homework is being set or marked
- If problems occur talk to your child's class teacher
- Take an active interest in your child's homework
