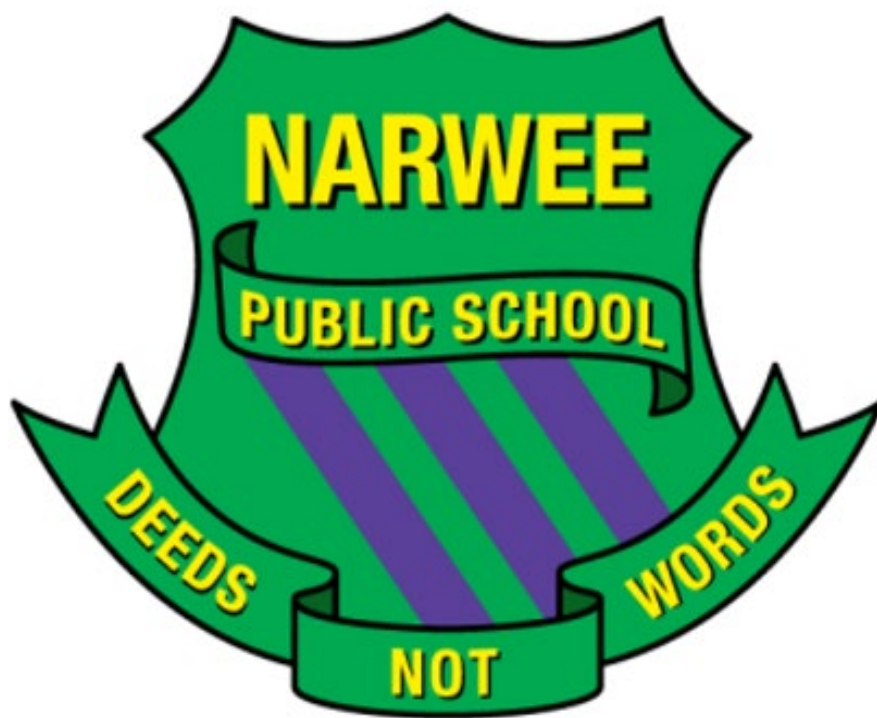

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Policy Statement

Narwee Public School aims to provide a safe, caring and welcoming learning place where all students and staff are treated with respect. Staff, students and parents share responsibility to ensure active support of the School Uniform Policy.

1. The wearing of school uniform is essential to

- maintain the school's atmosphere, identity, prestige, tone and spirit
- raising a sense of inclusiveness, non-discrimination and equal opportunity
- promoting within the students a sense of pride and school identity and enhance the supervision and safety of students on excursions and other school planned events
- defining an identity for the school within the local community
- developing students' sense of belonging to the school community
- reinforcing the perception of the school as an ordered and safe environment
- providing an opportunity to build school spirit
- enhancing positive community perceptions of public education

2. Benefits of school uniform

It has been found that the wearing of school uniform brings with it many benefits such as:

- enhancing the health and safety of students when involved in school activities
- promoting a sense of inclusiveness, non-discrimination and equal opportunity
- reinforcing the perception of the school as an ordered and safe environment
- increasing the personal safety of students and staff by allowing easier recognition of visitors and potential intruders in the school
- making school clothing more affordable for families by eliminating the risk of peer pressure to wear transiently fashionable and expensive clothes

3. Our beliefs

The wearing of school uniforms by students will assist the Narwee Public School community in:

- promoting the school's image within the community
- enhancing school spirit
- encouraging unity and equality between students
- increasing student confidence
- cost-saving for parents
- preparing students for dress and safety codes required by employers.

Uniform Procedures

4. Collaboration and Consultation

At Narwee Public School, the uniform has been designed in partnership with the P&C, staff and students. It is our intention that the uniform reflects the needs of students, their families and the school.

5. Uniform Requirements

Teachers, students, parents and caregivers work together to encourage students to wear full school uniform.

Uniform Procedures

Guidelines:

- Students wear the Narwee Public School uniform daily unless exemption has been granted by the principal, in line with Department of Education, Employment and Training policy
- The school uniform should encourage students to look neat and tidy as well as serving their practical needs
- Jewellery is not to be worn at school, however if a student has pierced ears, small plain studs or sleeper earrings can be worn
- Valuable item should not be worn at brought or worn at school
- Hair below the shoulders is to be tied back as per safety and to prevent head lice
- School staff will actively monitor and encourage the wearing of full school uniform
- Any underclothes eg long sleeved shirts under the uniform should be **white**

6. Uniform policy / responsibilities

This Uniform Policy will be actively supported by the School and the Parent community by recognising respective responsibilities.

School Responsibilities

- Narwee Public School will make the uniform available through external supplier:
Yeronga School Uniforms - 900 Canterbury Road Roselands, 2196
- Hats and PSSA soccer sport socks can be purchased from the school office
- Negotiate and liaise with the P&C in matters relating to the management of the Uniform Policy.
- Families who are experiencing financial difficulty are encouraged to contact the school - *when available, pre-loved uniforms can be purchased from the school office.*

Parent Responsibilities

- Support the school Uniform Policy by providing children with all items of uniform from Yeronga School Uniforms
- Contact the school if in need of support with uniform items

7. School uniform monitoring

Repeated and unexplained failure to wear full school uniform will result in a parent interview.

8. Implementation

- Uniform is to be worn as seasonally indicated
- Summer - Term 1 and Term 4 each year
- Winter - Term 2 and Term 3 each year
- On certain days, eg: school photos, PSSA sports, specific uniform may be designated at the school's discretion
