Covid-I9 Update

If a student or staff have flu like symptoms they should remain at home and have a Covid-19 test. The school must sight the negative test result in order for the student or staff member to return to school.

Both Covid-19 and the flu can have varying degrees of signs and symptoms, ranging from no symptoms (asymptomatic) to severe symptoms. Common symptoms that Covid-19 and the flu share include:

- Fever or feeling feverish/chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue (tiredness)
- Sore throat
- Runny or stuffy nose
- Muscle pain or body aches
- Headache
- Some people may have vomiting and diarrhoea, though this is more common in children than adults

All parents are asked to refrain from entering the front office unless necessary as you will be required to fill out a Covid-19 declaration form.

Kindergarten Enrolments

Contact Details

Have you changed your contact details?

There have been many occasions recently where we have tried to contact parents and have been unable to do so due to parents not informing the school of changed phone numbers or addresses.

Please ensure all parent / carer and emergency contact details are up to date. This is a safety issue as we need to be able to contact all parents in the event that your child injures themselves or becomes ill at school.

Please notify the office if your details need changing. We appreciate your assistance in this matter.

Mobile Phones at School

If it is necessary for your child to bring a mobile phone to school, they must hand their phone in at the administration office as soon as they arrive at school. A note must be supplied to the school stating the reason your child needs to bring their phone to school to keep in their file. Phones are then to be collected at the end of the school day. This is to ensure the safety and wellbeing of all students.

Bring a Water Bottle

Please ensure your child has a drink bottle which can be refilled throughout the day, as it is recommended that students do not drink directly from a bubbler at this time. There are many taps close by to classrooms, where students are able to fill their water bottle during the day.

Drop Off & Pick Up Information

Just a reminder that parents are asked to 'drop at the gates and go' from 9.00 – 9.20am.

Gates will be opened at 3.15pm for the afternoon pickup. Please wait on the asphalt areas and do not go onto the verandahs. Teachers will send your child to you once you are there.

If you need to speak with your child's teacher, use the ClassDojo messaging system or phone through to the front office to leave a message.

Please maintain appropriate social distancing whilst you wait outside the school gates. In a wonderful school community such as ours, where we value the connections with each other, we understand this is difficult, but based on the current health advice, we seek your support in following these guidelines.

We look forward to the time when parents are able to be back on school grounds, but in the meantime, please stay in contact with what is happening at school through our newsletter, website and ClassDojo.

Kinder 2021 Transition

We are able to hold a transition morning for our 2021 Kindergarten students.

Unfortunately we are unable to meet as adult so we ask that you drop your child off and come back between 10.45am and 11.00am to pick them up.

Selective High School 2022

Selective High Schools cater for academically gifted students with high potential who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates at their own academic standard. Selective High Schools help these students by grouping them with students of similar ability, and by using specialised teaching methods.

Applications for selective high school placement are considered mainly on the basis of the Selective High School Placement Test results and school assessment scores. The Selective High School Placement Test will be held on Thursday 11 March 2021.

If you would like to have your child considered for Year 7 selective high school entry in 2022, you need to apply on the internet using a valid email address (not the student's email address).

The application website opened on Tuesday 6 October and closes on Monday 9 November 2020. You must apply before the closing date.

There are no paper application forms. If you do not have internet access, you can apply at a public library. If you have a disability that prevents you from using a computer, you can contact the high performance team for assistance.

You must submit only ONE application for each student.

An expression of interest note was sent home with all Year 5 students in Week 10 of last term. Please note: the tear off slip is not an application and the school cannot apply on your behalf.

Book Club - Issue 7

Issue 7 of Book Club has been sent home with all students. Please be reminded there have been changes to the way Book Club can be paid for. If you would like to purchase anything for your child it must be done though the Scholastic Loop system.

When paying by LOOP you do not need to fill in the order form or return anything to school. Your order will be electronically linked to the school's order. The order will then be delivered to the school approximately 10 days after the closing date.

School Uniforms

At Narwee Public School we take great pride in our school uniform and it's wonderful to see the majority of our students wearing the correct items.

There has been an increase in students wearing incorrect items of clothing and footwear to school. Please ensure your child wears the correct uniform each day.

Please remember that only school hats and jackets are to be worn.

Riding of Bikes to School

It is wonderful to see that some of our students are riding their bikes and scooters to school each day. However, with this privilege comes responsibility in regards to being safe and respectful riders.

In the mornings, students are able to enter through either school gate but must dismount from their bike or scooter once they are on school grounds and walk them to the bike rack.

At the end of the day, all bikes and scooters are to be walked out of the school and can be ridden safely along the footpath. Students should be mindful of pedestrians when riding along the footpath.

Head Lice

As we are sure you will agree, head lice infestations and subsequent treatment can be a major headache.

To help minimise any outbreaks at school, we ask that you notify the office or your child's class teacher if your child has head lice so that we can send a note home to inform the other families of your child's class to check their child's hair. All reports made to the school are confidential.

Opportunity Class Test

To maintain the health, safety and wellbeing of students, the 2020 Opportunity Class Placement Test has been rescheduled to Wednesday 18 November 2020 and will take place on-site at Narwee Public School. Parents will receive 'Test Authority' advice by Wednesday 4 November 2020.

Only students whose parents have received a confirmation email from the High Performing Students Team are eligible to sit the test on the new date of 18 November 2020.

The application portal will not be re-opened for new applications. These changes have been made to the placement process for this year only.

The revised application and placement process will ensure students are placed in Year 5 opportunity classes as early in 2021 as possible.

Important Reminders

As we commence a new term we ask that you take some time to reflect and act on the following areas in the interest of helping to keep our students safe around the school.

- Students must not be left unsupervised at school before 8.50am and after 3.20pm. Before and After School Care is provided by 3 Bridges. For more details, they can be contacted on 9580 0688.
- If your child is coming to/and from school by car, please ensure that they are dropped off and picked up safely in the appropriate areas outside the school.
- Please take the time to revise road safety behaviour with your child. This includes walking on footpaths, crossing streets, getting into and out of cars, using traffic lights etc.
- Please take the time to revise Stranger Danger messages with your child.
- Please ensure that your child has their school hat with them each day as Narwee Public School has a no hat-no play policy.
- If you have any concerns, please message your child's class teacher through Class Dojo.

School News

From time to time issues or disagreements may occur between students. It is the responsibility of staff members to deal with these matters.

We ask all parents / carers to bring these matters to the attention of a staff member or the Principal rather than approaching students and discussing matters directly with them.

Parking Near the School

When dropping off or picking up your child please ensure you park in the appropriate streets surrounding the school. Take note to comply with the 'No Stopping' and 'Bus Zones' along Broad Arrow Rd.

There is a Kiss and Drop zone opposite the school. In this area drivers may stop to drop off or pick up children however, 'No Parking' rules apply.

- Maximum stop time is 2 minutes
- Driver must remain in or within 3 metres of their vehicle
- Vehicles must not be left unattended

The police and rangers patrol around the school regularly. Fines can be quite expensive for parking illegally around a school.

Please be mindful of our neighbours when dropping off or picking up your children by not blocking or parking across driveways particularly around the Esme Lane Parade area.

Did You Know.....

If your child misses as little as 8 days in a school term, by the end of primary school they will have missed a year of education.

Going to school every day is important. What your child learns each day builds on what they learnt the day before. If your child misses school, they miss information, their learning routine is broken, they lose confidence and miss out on building their friendships.

If your child has to be away from school due to illness, religious or family circumstances, please let your child's teacher know and send a signed note explaining the reason for their absence as soon as they return to school.

If your child arrives at school late they must go to the office to collect a late note. If they need to leave early you will need to go to the office to sign them out.

If you are having difficulties getting your child to school each day, and on time, please talk to their class teacher or Mrs Monin.

Cyberbullying

A reminder to all our parents and carers that it is strongly recommended that children under the age of 13 should NOT be using social media sites of any kind.

By doing so, children run the risk of cyberbullying and are generally not mature enough to be able to deal with cyberbullies or run the risk of implicating themselves by responding inappropriately.
