Congratulations to all our Kindergarten students for being at school, settled and ready to learn! They are following the routines and forming new friendships that should take them through their 7 years of primary school. I've been impressed with how they are learning and getting along with each other each time I've visited their classroom.

Thank you for taking the opportunity to meet your child's teacher at our Parent Teacher Information sessions today. In Weeks 9 & 10 we have individual parent / teacher meetings where you can sit down and talk about your child's progress, learning and socialisation. Remember if you need to meet with a teacher, a quick phone call to school is all that is needed to arrange a suitable meeting time.

Our P&C currently meet at 9.30am on Wednesdays in Weeks 2 and 7 each term. Another option is to meet at 7.00pm once per term so I have included a tear-off slip so you can indicate which time is your preference for attending these meetings.

The next P&C meeting will be the Annual General Meeting where we elect a President, Secretary and Treasurer for 2020. P&Cs are formed to promote the interests of the school through our parents, carers and the community coming together and working in close cooperation. The roles of each committee member is outlined in the note sent home today. You can nominate yourself or another person for a position. Having a vibrant P&C will mean that fundraisers and public events will have a stronger community focus. The current P&C are planning a Mother's Day raffle and they are asking for donations of new goods or services that they can include. Please see me if you can help with this.

We have many extra-curricular programs at Narwee Public School with dance, skipping, choir and band groups as well as 3 seasons of PSSA sport being offered. I thank our teachers for giving their time, commitment and enthusiasm in order to provide these opportunities to our students.

Best wishes to our school leaders who will lead the first K-6 assembly this Friday. I know they will be excellent role models, displaying confidence and organisational skills.

Noise Levels

To allow students to concentrate and work productively in their class it is important to keep noise levels outside the classrooms to a minimum.

We ask that parents who wait for their children in the afternoon do not wait on the verandahs near classroom doors so that noise levels do not disrupt the learning of students. Your assistance in this matter is much appreciated.



Behaviour Levels System

Our Behaviour Levels System has been carefully designed based on rewards and consequences and is intended to make students responsible for their own actions and behaviours. It is a very fair system which sets out clear guidelines indicating what can be expected to happen at each level.

Each student starts on Bronze Level with the aim of reaching GOLD Level with demonstrated good behaviour. Poor behaviours will result in students dropping down levels to 4, 5 or even 6, with appropriate consequences.

This is how the process works:

1. All staff meet in Weeks 3, 6 and 9 and each child's name is read out with the level that their teacher believes they should be placed on.
2. Any staff member who objects to this level speaks up.
3. The child's behaviour is discussed until everyone agrees on the level of the child.

Students may move down a level at any time if they display poor behaviours. If a student is placed on detention, parents are notified by receiving a pink detention note. These notes must be signed by a parent and returned to the school the following day.

Last week, teachers held their first levels meeting of the year. This year has begun particularly well and students have been very calm and sensible. The majority of students remained on Bronze Level as teachers are still getting to know them and establishing class rules and expectations. It is hoped that at our next meeting in Week 6 students will start to move up. Those students on Bronze Level and above will be rewarded with a special day called Acknowledgement Day at the end of the term where students are allowed to wear mufti clothing and participate in organised fun activities for part of the day.

Our school is currently going through changes as we are becoming a 'Positive Behaviour for Learning' school. As a result, there may be some alterations throughout the year to some of the systems. Notifications of any changes and new information will be made through the newsletter as they take effect.

School Resources

The cost is \$5.00 which includes pool and carnival entry. If your child is attending the carnival, please ensure their permission note and payment are due back by Friday 28 February. Parents are welcome to attend. Entry is \$2.50 for spectators.

Screening Assessments

Screening Assessment Permission

As you may be aware, our school has employed a Speech Pathologist and Occupational Therapist to work with our teachers to support the Speech and Language skills of our students. Most schools do not offer these services.

As part of the programs being offered to our school, the Speech Pathologist & Occupational Therapist have offered to provide screening assessments of children who appear to be demonstrating some weaknesses.

A screening test is a brief guide to a child's abilities and allows us to see how a child is functioning compared to other children of their age. A screening test also indicates whether full diagnostic testing is warranted.

There is no cost to you for this assessment.

Please notify your child's teacher if you **DO NOT** want your child to take part in this screening process. If you do not notify your child's teacher, then your permission is assumed.

You will be notified if your child's results indicate that a full diagnostic assessment is needed.

Ride to School Day

If you ride, walk or scoot to school you will receive a raffle ticket from your teacher in class. This ticket will go in the draw for our Road Safety prizes at the next K-6 assembly.

Make sure you get your Bike Licence and don't forget to wear your helmet! If you have lost your Bike Licence note a new one can be downloaded from the school website.

Medical Insurance

Parents, please note there is no personal injury insurance cover provided by the NSW Department of Education for students in relation to school sporting activities, physical education lessons or any other school activity.

Parents and carers are advised to assess the level and extent of their child's involvement in the sport program offered by the school, school sport zone, region and state school sport associations when deciding whether additional insurance cover, above that provided by Medicare is required.

Personal accident insurance cover is available through normal retail insurance outlets. The NSW Supplementary Sporting Injury Benefits Scheme, funded by the NSW Government, provides limited cover for serious injury resulting in the permanent loss of a prescribed faculty or the use of some prescribed part of the body.

Sport Levy

School Parking

Parking for parents is available along Mountview Ave, Chamberlain St and further down Broad Arrow Rd.

Please comply with the 'No Stopping', 'No Parking' and 'Bus Zone' areas outside the school. There is a 'Kiss and Drop' zone across the road from the school.

Please remember the maximum stop time is 2 minutes and drivers must remain in or within 3 metres of their car. Vehicles must not be left unattended.

The police and parking rangers regularly patrol the area and fines can be expensive for parking illegally around a school.

Please keep the school driveway clear at all times and be mindful of our neighbours when parking near the school.

Mobile Phones

Mobile phones have become an integral part of our society and lifestyle. Whilst we recognise this trend, we strongly encourage Narwee students NOT to bring their mobile phones to school unless absolutely necessary.

A reminder about the procedures for mobile phones at Narwee PS if it is essential for a student to bring a phone to school:

- Students must bring a signed note from their parent/carer to the office explaining why a mobile phone is being brought to school.
- Students must take their mobile phone to the office each morning upon arrival at school and sign it in.
- Students are to collect their phone at 3.20pm and sign it out.
- Mobile phones are not to be kept with students during the day and MUST NOT be used to take photos or videos at school.

The sign in book for mobile phones is kept behind the office counter – all students must hand their phone to the office staff to be stored for the day. Students MUST NOT just leave their mobile phones on the counter and walk away.

Students are not permitted to use their phones throughout the day to take calls from parents or to make calls. If you need to get an urgent message to your child about changes to pick up arrangements etc please call the office on 9153 9756 or 9153 5578 and the office staff will pass on a message to your child's class teacher.

Lost Property

Medication at School

Please be reminded that under no circumstances are students permitted to have medication in their school bags other than their asthma puffer. This is for the safety of all our students.

Sun Safety

Australia has the highest rate of skin cancer in the world. Remind your child to protect themselves from sun and heat exposure while at school by:

- Reducing their exposure to the sun wherever possible.
- Playing in shaded areas particularly during peak UV levels.
- Wearing their school hat in the playground at all times to protect their face, neck and ears.
- Drink plenty of water.
- Use 30+ broad spectrum water resistant sunscreen

Food Safety

You can keep your child's food for school cooler during hot days by chilling food in the fridge before packing your child's lunch and then putting a frozen ice brick into their lunch box. The food will stay about 12 degrees cooler.

Student Absences

If your child is absent for any reason, please send a signed note explaining the reason for their absence on the day they return to school. If your child will be absent for 3 days or more, please notify the school on 9153 9756 or 9153 5578.

Asthma Update

We are currently updating our records to ensure we have the correct medical information on file regarding students with asthma. As some children grow out of the condition, or no longer require medication, this needs to be noted on their records.

If your child's medical needs have changed, please notify the office so that their records can be adjusted accordingly.

Contact Details

Have you changed your address or contact details during the holidays?

It is important that the school has up to date contact details in the event that your child becomes ill at school. Children often become distressed when we are unable to contact their parents.

We ask all parents to complete the 'Update Contact Details' form that has been sent home with all students and return it to your child's class teacher by Friday 21 February so that we can check we have the most current details for you.

Online Payments

Parents are able to make online payments for amounts owing for students, via a secure payment page hosted by Westpac. Payments can be made using either a Visa or MasterCard credit or debit card. The payment page is accessed from the front page of the school's website by clicking on **\$Make a Payment**

Items that can be paid include voluntary contributions, excursions, school resources and creative & practical arts activities (these include band, choir and dance).

Please note: PSSA sport levy cannot be paid online. This must be paid to the sports teachers each Friday morning before getting on the bus.

When you access \$Make a Payment you must enter:

- The student's name, class and reference to what you are making a payment for.

These details must be entered each time you make a payment as student information is not held within the system.

This is a secure payment system hosted by Westpac to ensure that your credit/debit card details are captured in a secure manner – these details are not passed back to the school.

You have the ability to check any details of the payment before the payment is processed. Receipts can be emailed and/or printed. As a receipt has been issued from the payment page a further receipt will not be issued by the school.

Details of the payments are passed daily to the school where they will be receipted against your child's account. This daily report includes online payments made prior to 6.00pm the previous day. Payments made after 6.00pm will NOT be reflected in the next day's report. Please be mindful of this if there is a payment deadline for an event.

All school permission slips allow parents/carers to add the receipt number of online payments to assist with reconciling the payment against the student's activity.

It is important that your child's permission note is returned to their class teacher once the online payment has been processed.

Pay Online

Money Collection

It is important that all money for excursions, school resources, book club etc be sent to school in a sealed envelope or a zip lock bag with your child's name clearly printed on the front. Please do not send loose money as it can easily be lost on the way to school.

All notes and envelopes with money enclosed must be handed to your child's class teacher not to the front office.

High School Information Session

A package called 'Moving into Year 7 in a Government High School' will soon be distributed to all Year 6 students. In this package, there is an Expression of Interest form that needs to be completed by ALL Year 6 families.

These forms are sometimes confusing for parents and they are due back promptly – on or before Friday 20 March.

With this in mind, we are inviting parents/carers to join with our Year 6 students on Wednesday 4 March in the hall for a meeting at 2.30pm. During this meeting, we will distribute the package to any parents/carers in attendance and then explain the steps for completing the Expression of Interest.

If you are a parent of a Year 5 student, you are also welcome to come and listen as this will help you prepare for next year.

We hope to see you there.

Stage 3 Teachers

Kindergarten Helpful Hint

Parents with a child in Kindergarten – it is advisable to pack a spare change of underwear in your child's school bag. Kindergarten children often become so engrossed in their play or activities and sometimes forget to stop for a toilet break. Others just don't make it in time.

Although we have a very small supply of underwear, it is much better for your child if they have their own to change into. If your child has an accident at school and comes home in school underwear or clothes, we ask that these are washed and returned to school at your earliest convenience.
