## Peer Support Training




Parent / Teacher interviews are important and teachers would like to see all parents so they can share information in order to assist your child achieve the best possible outcomes.


Each interview should take approximately 10-15 minutes.

# House Points & Uniform Spot Check Points





### **Head Lice**

Head Lice infestations are a common occurrence particularly in primary school.

- About 23% of primary students have head lice at any one time.
- Anyone can get head lice regardless of age, sex or how clean their hair is.
- Head lice move from one person's head to another via hair.
- Head lice do not survive long when they are off a human head.
- Head lice do not live on furniture, hats, bedding or carpet.
- Head lice have built up some resilience to treatments.

#### **Treatment**

Chemical treatments are available from the chemist or supermarkets. Daily combing with a white conditioner using a fine tooth comb is also effective in getting rid of head lice and eggs (nits).

#### Tips for reducing the spread of head lice

As infestations are particularly common in primary schools it is best to choose a treatment that can be used over time. There is no single solution to eradication, only perseverance.

- Regularly check your child's hair.
- Teach older children to check their own hair.
- Tie back and braid longer hair.
- Keep a fine tooth head lice comb in the bathroom and encourage all family members to use it when they wash their hair.

### **School Resources**

School Resource Fee notes were sent home with all students in Week 2. This fee covers items such as Home Reading requirements, school magazines, online programs, handwriting books along with other resources your child will be using throughout the year.

If you have not already made this payment please ensure it is made by Friday 6 March.

All students are required to pay this fee.

If you are going to be late picking up your child it is also important that you contact the school prior to 3.20pm.

### **School Start Time**

#### Teachers are not on duty until 8.50am

If your child arrives at school before 8.50am they could be alone and unsupervised. Parents/carers are responsible for the supervision of their child/children before 8.50am.

If your child arrives before this time they need to be in the care of an adult for their own safety and not be left unsupervised.

Before and After School Care is offered for students of our school by 3 Bridges. This care is offered on-site. Please contact 3 Bridges on 9580 0688 if you would like more information.

## Road Safety

For the safety of all school children please do not stop or park your car on or near any pedestrian crossing and ensure you observe all safety and 'No Stopping' signs.

A child's perception, judgement and awareness of potentially dangerous situations is generally not sufficiently developed to properly cope with the road environment until they are at least 10 years of age. Children need adults to set a good example and to supervise them closely in and around traffic including roundabouts, traffic lights and car parks.

Remember that watching children is never enough. Keep your children safe by holding their hands as you cross any road.

Please remind your child that crossing the road should always be done with care. Important things they should remember are:

- Always cross the road at a pedestrian crossing or traffic lights.
- Always look right, then left and right again before crossing the road to check there are no cars coming.
