Behaviour Levels

Last week the staff at Narwee were involved in the last Behaviour Levels meeting for this term. As a result:

- 49.85% of students are now on Silver Level
- 47.66% of students are now on Bronze Level
- 2.49% of students are on the unacceptable level of 4 or 5

It is wonderful to see so many students on their way to Gold Level.

On Friday 3 July (this week) we will be holding our Acknowledgement Day to celebrate the good behaviour of most of our students. All students on Bronze and Silver Level will be rewarded by being able to wear mufti clothing (with sensible jogger type shoes of course) and be involved in fun activities between lunch and recess on this day. Students will receive a piece of fruit at the conclusion of their activities as well.

There will also be a special raffle on Acknowledgement Day. Teachers have been giving out tokens in the playground to students displaying safe or respectful behaviour. The tokens have been put into our raffle barrel and 20 tokens will be drawn during the day.

While the activities are running students below Bronze Level will be discussing their behaviour with a teacher and making plans to improve it.

School Camp

Expression of Interest

At this time we are unable to predict with certainty whether the camp we have booked in Term 4 will go ahead. Sport and Recreation camps are currently changing their procedures and policies to make camps as safe as possible for those attending.

We are asking for Expression of Interest notes so that if we are told camps are allowed we will be able to organise ourselves in a timely manner.

This year we hope to be giving students in Years 4, 5 & 6 the opportunity to attend camp at Berry Sport and Recreation. The camp will be for 4 nights and 5 days from Monday 26 October to Friday 30 October 2020.

With school and community subsidies, the cost per child will be approximately \$375.00. Included in this price are all meals, coach hire, accommodation, day time activities with expert tuition and night time activities which makes the overall cost very reasonable.

Berry Sport and Recreation is located in the Shoalhaven Region, approximately 2 hours drive south of Sydney. It is set in beautiful bush land and has modern accommodation and excellent facilities.

60 places have been booked. We ask that you complete the Expression of Interest note that has been sent home with all Year 5 and 6 students if you would like your child to take part in this camp.

As places are limited the camp will be offered to Yr 5 & 6 students first. It will then be offered to Yr 4 students to attend. Priority will be given to those students who return their Expression of Interest note first.

Please ensure your Expression of Interest note is returned to Mrs Dewsnap in the front office not the class teacher. This ensures we are able to keep an accurate account of the order in which students return their note. Your child's note must be returned by Friday 3 July.

The assessments are suitable for students wishing to extend themselves academically and take up the personal challenge of competing in an international assessment. Your child will be presented with high-quality, expert-developed questions, allowing them to apply their learning without the need for prior study or revision.

ICAS Assessments are now online, a move that reflects a sector-wide transition to computer-based assessments. This allows greater accessibility for students and faster delivery of results.

ICAS fees are to be paid directly online to UNSW Global, not to the school. Visit the online Parent Payment System to make a direct payment to UNSW Global.

Please note: all entry fees are to be paid directly to UNSW Global using their online Parent Payment System. No entries can be accepted at the school.

Please do not pay using the schools' online parent payment link on the school's website.

As all money is paid to the university in advance NO REFUNDS can be given if your child is absent on the day of the assessment.

Payments must be made by Friday 17 July 2020.



Hours of Supervision

Unfortunately, we have a number of students left unsupervised at school outside school hours. There are a number of students who are being dropped off prior to 8.50am and left at school after 3.20pm.

Teachers are on duty at school from 8.50am until 3.20pm. During this time, all students are actively supervised. Whilst our staff are usually at school for much longer than these hours, they are not responsible for supervision of students after school hours. Staff are involved in a number of activities during this time, including staff meetings and preparation.

Outside of these hours, student supervision is the responsibility of parents and carers.

Whilst student well-being is critical to us here at Narwee Public School, and we will continue to ensure the safety of students where there has been a genuine emergency preventing parents from collecting their child on time, we ask all parents to please take note of the school supervision hours and ensure that you have suitable arrangements in place for the care and supervision of your child prior to 8.50am and after 3.20pm.

Should my Child Attend School?

In the midst of winter, we naturally have many cold and flu bugs at school. Unfortunately, the sick bay is frequently busy with children coming to visit due to temperatures, vomiting and general cold symptoms. Although regular attendance at school is important – it is also essential that children are fit and well when at school. If your child has been vomiting or had diarrhoea, the best advice is to keep them home until 24 hours after the vomiting / diarrhoea has stopped.

Children who are unwell should be kept at home until the symptoms have cleared.

No Parking

Thank you parents and carers for your adherence to the parking signs at the front of the school, enabling students to be safely picked up and dropped off.

Please note that the 'No Parking' zones outside the school are labelled with times 8.30am – 9.30am and 2.45pm – 3.30pm.

This sign clearly indicates that during the specified times no parking is permitted. Drivers are permitted to drop off or pick up passengers but only a 2 minute period is permissible. Note that parking is not permitted in the bus zone, no stopping zone or across driveways. We thank you for your support in keeping our students safe.

Student Absences

If your child is absent for any reason, please send a signed note explaining the reason for their absence on the day they return to school. If your child will be absent for 3 days or more, please notify the school on 9153 9756 or 9153 5578.

Speaking Another Language
