Covid-I9 Update

If a student or staff have flu like symptoms they should remain at home and have a Covid-19 test. The school must sight the negative test result in order for the student or staff member to return to school.

Both Covid-19 and the flu can have varying degrees of signs and symptoms, ranging from no symptoms (asymptomatic) to severe symptoms. Common symptoms that Covid-19 and the flu share include:

- Fever or feeling feverish/chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue (tiredness)
- Sore throat
- Runny or stuffy nose
- Muscle pain or body aches
- Headache
- Some people may have vomiting and diarrhoea, though this is more common in children than adults

All parents are asked to refrain from entering the front office unless necessary as you will be required to fill out a Covid-19 declaration form.

Kindergarten Enrolments

It is nearing the end of Term 3 already and we are currently planning for our 2021 Kindergarten enrolments.

If you have a child who will be turning 5 before 30 July 2021 and are intending to enrol them for next year, please complete an application form as soon as possible and return it to the office. We ask for your assistance in ensuring applications are sent in as soon as possible.

Application to Enrol forms are available via the school office or alternatively you can call the office and a pack will be sent home with your child. The form is also available to download from the schools' website and from Monday 14 September you are able to enrol via the new Online Enrolment System.

Those parents who do not live in the catchment area and wish to send their child to Narwee Public School are also required to complete an out of area application form, which will be reviewed by the Out of Area Panel.

Enrolment News

We are excited to announce we will be rolling out the new Online Enrolment System from Monday 14 September 2020.

The Online Enrolment System is designed to provide flexibility for parents to submit an enrolment application online and at a time that best suits them. The application can be accessed on all browsers and mobile devices including iOS and Android.

The online application process is currently restricted to:

- Enrolments into local schools only
- Children who are Australian citizens, New Zealand citizens or permanent residents
- Children who live in NSW

We offer our support and encourage parents to complete their child's application to enrol online. If however, parents do not feel comfortable completing an application online, a paper copy will be available for collection from the front office or can be downloaded from the our website.

Behaviour Levels Report

In Week 6, the staff was again involved in the behaviour levelling process. As a result:

- 25.63% of students are on Gold Level
- 54.43% of students are on Silver Level
- 19.62% of students are on Bronze Level
- 0.32% of students are on the unacceptable level of 4, 5 or 6

It is great to see so many of our students now on Gold Level. Students on this level have to attain a certain level of behaviour.

The criteria for Gold Level selection are set out below:

Be Safe

- Always follow school rules
- Be punctual to school and to class after lunch & recess and to start work

Be Respectful

- Respect everyone including teachers, students, casual teachers and helpers
- Wear full school uniform
- Always display a positive attitude

Be an Active Learner

- Always strive to do their best
- Make an effort to be involved in all organised school activities and events
- Show initiative
- Be organised with classroom equipment e.g. pens, pencils, rulers etc
- Do homework to the best of their ability

Congratulations to our wonderful Gold students. Students on Silver and Bronze Level have the potential to also reach Gold. So parents, please encourage your child to strive to improve their behaviour and effort.

It is hoped that by Week 9 students below Bronze Level can move themselves up. We want all of our students to be on Bronze Level and above. We know they can do it but it is up to them to make the right choices.

Label Everything
