Swimming Carnival 2023

Our annual Swimming Carnival will be held on **Friday 3 February 2023** from 10.00am at Hurstville Aquatic Centre.

All children in Years 3, 4, 5, 6 and Year 2 turning 8 in 2023 are expected to attend. As this is an authorised school activity, all teachers will be attending the carnival.

Activities will be provided to enable all children, both swimmers and non-swimmers to participate. 100m, 50m and 25m races will be held in the 2 metre deep pool and novelty events will be held in the 1 metre deep end of the pool or the wading pool. Those students who participate in deep water races will also participate in the novelty events. House points will be given to all children who take part in the novelty and competition events.

Please indicate your child's swimming ability in the appropriate section on the permission slip below.

Travel to and from the pool will be by bus, leaving the school at approximately 9.30am and returning by 3.20pm.

Students must be at school by 9.00am. Due to time restrictions we are unable to wait for late arrivals.

The cost is \$10.00. This amount covers bus fare and pool hire charges and has been subsidised by the school.

No refunds will be given if your child is absent on the day as bus hire and pool entry is paid in advance and are not refundable to the school.

Due to the carnival being held early in the year we ask that money and permission notes be returned by Friday **9 December 2022**.

Children can wear their house colours or their sports uniform with accessories in their house colour. They must ensure that they have a hat, swimmers and a towel.

Children must also bring their lunch, recess and drinks for the day as there is no canteen for students.
